

Safe Camping in the Mountains

For campground emergencies (i.e. electricity not working, broken water line, or disruptive behavior), you will find an emergency walkie-talkie located on the exterior of the office building. This 2-way radio will give you direct communication with campground management. For assistance in the middle of the night, you may need to call more than once to wake us up.

Speed limit is **5mph** starting at the entry of the campground, down the driveway, and throughout the campground. Please use caution when driving on the property, as children are playing.

As Smokey the Bear always says, "Only you can prevent forest fires." Please be aware there are **burn restrictions** in many areas of Colorado. Only propane and charcoal are allowed at this campground. You may dispose of your charcoal waste in the aluminum trash cans provided in the campground. In order to prevent air pollution in the campground and 2nd-hand smoke, this is a non-smoking property. Thank you for not smoking anywhere in or around the campground.

Storing your food and disposing garbage properly can mean life or death to a bear. Bears learn quickly and will return to areas where they find food, not only is this dangerous for people, but is also harmful to bears. Due to the frequent bear activity in the campground, do not leave trash or trash receptacles outside. Dumpsters are locked every evening at 9 p.m. to prevent the habituation of wildlife. **Expect to see bears anytime between early evening and late morning. Bear safety is required.**
